- If an employee is injured while on the jobsite, fellow employees should
 - tell the injured worker to go tell someone at the next scheduled break
 - continue working and keep the injury a secret

- Before beginning any given task on a jobsite, the employee should
 - inspect the area for potential safety hazards

- While on the jobsite, it is important for all employees to

- Before using a respirator, every employee should
 - set the respirator down on the facepiece
 - adjust the respirator so it will fit extremely tight
 - remove the cartridge filter
 - inspect your respirator to assure that it is complete and in good condition
- The employee is required to do the following regarding their respirators (may be more than one correct answer)
 - clean your respirator each day you use it
 - sanitize your respirator weekly
 - store your respirator in its resealable plastic bag when not in use
 - make sure the face is clean shaven to allow for a proper seal

 - Always face the ladder when ascending or descending.

 - Never climb higher than the third rung from the top on straight or extension ladders, or the second tread from the top of stepladders.
 - As long as you are wearing rubber gloves, it is okay to use metal ladders around electrical circuits or power lines.
